Peppers

	<p><i>Carmen F-1 Sweet Pepper</i></p> <p>SWEET! Carmen F-1s are a perfect sweet pepper for grilling or adding to any stir-fry. These pepper plants can be harvested once green or until red. Indeterminate.</p>
	<p><i>Ace Bell Pepper</i></p> <p>Sweet! No drama plant! Extra-early, highly productive standard. Huge yields of medium-size, 3-4 lobed fruits. Has tolerance to blossom drop. Indeterminate.</p>
	<p><i>White Bell Pepper</i></p> <p>Sweet and crispy! If you want a bell pepper with a unique coloring in your salad or snack platter, harvest these when they're white (they will later mature to orange or red).</p>
	<p><i>Shishito Pepper</i></p> <p>Mild to Medium: Enhance your meal with 50-200 SHU of spice! These peppers are mild but can still pack a bit of heat but are less than a jalapeno. Great for people who like a little spice but not too much.</p>

	<p><i>Jedi Hot Jalapeno Pepper</i></p> <p>Moderate: The force awakens in this Jedi, which grows about 4–5 inches long. If you enjoy a bit of spice in your chili, you're in luck because this jalapeno is only 2,500–3,500 SHUs.</p>
	<p><i>Red Rocket Pepper</i></p> <p>Medium to Hot: Red Rockets are both a sweet and spicy pepper, being 30,000–50,000 SHUs. Once matured (to green or red), peppers can be harvested once they reach 4 inches long. Annual & Open-pollinated.</p>
	<p><i>Cayenne Pepper</i></p> <p>Medium to HOT!! This spicy, chili pepper packs quite a punch for its size (10–25 cm) and is rated 30,000–50,000 SHUs. Use this guy to spice up your dish or ground him to a powder to season anything your heart desires.</p>
	<p><i>Cajun (Craze) Habanero</i></p> <p>HOT!!! Try this super-hot pepper (1,320,000 SHUs) that will knock you off your socks. This pepper is nearly as hot as a California Reaper!</p>
	<p><i>Red Trinidad Cross Habanero</i></p> <p>HOT!!! This Red Trinidad and Naga Viper cross-bred pepper is fruity with a kick. The plant will bear peppers 1–3 inches in size.</p>
	<p><i>Bhut Orange Ghost Pepper</i></p> <p>HOT!! Intensify your tastebuds with this ghost pepper. At 1,041,427 SHU, this pepper is 3x more than a habanero. This pepper builds up spice after every bite.</p>

Tomatoes

	<p><i>Amana Gram Heirloom Tomato (SLICER)</i></p> <p>This massive 2-pound tomato from down the road yields a fruity, sweet flavor perfect for any salad. Bright orange and with rich flavor, this is a staple for all Iowa gardens! Indeterminate.</p>
	<p><i>Quisenberry Brandywine Tomato (SLICER)</i></p> <p>A staple for every garden. Brandywine's luscious, heirloom flavor is "very rich, loud, and distinctively spicy." The large fruits, often over 1-pound, have a deep pink skin and smooth, red flesh. Indeterminate & USDA Certified Organic.</p>
	<p><i>Big Beef Tomato (SLICER)</i></p> <p>This sweet, meaty tomato is the perfect slicer on any sandwich! These plants yield large, disease-resistant tomatoes, about 10-12 oz., and are resistant to cracking. A great hybrid for those who want a low-drama tomato with great taste. Indeterminate.</p>
	<p><i>Macedonian Oxheart Tomato (SLICER)</i></p> <p>These tomatoes will steal your heart with their deep pink, heart-shaped fruits and sweet, rich, intense tomato flavor. Meaty and juicy slicer. Macedonian Oxheart tomatoes vary between 12-14 oz. Indeterminate.</p>
	<p><i>Tobago Heirloom Tomato (SLICER)</i></p> <p>Bright red flesh, juicy and dense with a zingy acidic taste. Fruits weigh between 4-10 oz. and turn even darker wherever the sun hits them. It has a well-balanced taste of old-fashioned heirloom tomatoes.</p>



San Marzano Tomato (PASTE)

Include the San Marzano in your garden. Thinner and pointier than a Roma, it has a sweeter, less acidic flavor that's perfect for canning.



Siberian Red Tomato (PLANTER)

Perfect for patio gardens, this compact plant produces medium-sized, 5 oz. tomatoes with striking taste! From Siberia, it flourishes in cold weather, unlike other plants, and can still set fruit even in 38-degree weather. Give it a try with Iowa's erratic weather! Indeterminate.



Slackard's Tomato (MEDIUM)

These large, clear-skinned, Slackard's tomatoes are ribbed with hollow seed locules with a lively and distinctive flavor. Grow this indeterminate plant up to maturity after 76 days.



Wapsi Peach Heirloom Tomato

Native to Iowa and named for the local river, don't let this fuzzy fruit scare you. Wapsi tomatoes are incredibly sweet and will melt in your mouth. Larger than a cherry but smaller than a Roma, these are a lunch box favorite. Move over candy, Wapsi is the new sweet treat! Heirloom & Indeterminate.



Red Cherry Tomato (CHERRY)

Everything you want in a large tomato but within a bite-sized snack! This sweet, tangy, and juicy tomato will pop and melt in your mouth. Indeterminate.



Chiapa Wild Tomato (CHERRY)

"Wild" is the perfect word to describe these abundant and tasty plants that try to defy its surroundings. Perfect for a container on the patio! This plant will yield cherry–small currant–tomatoes, perfect as a garnish. Indeterminate.



Schlitcht's Orange Tomato (CHERRY)

1–inch, cherry–sized orange tomatoes that are addictively bold in flavor. Great for salads and snacking. After trying this cherry, you'll never go back to red! Heavy producer until frost, this tomato is great in pot, gardens, school gardens and front flowerbeds. This intermediate plant matures around 75 days. Indeterminate.



Sungold Cherry Tomato (CHERRY)

Sungold tomatoes are extra sweet and stay firmer longer than other cherry tomato varieties! Indeterminate.

Other Vegetables



Pancho Tomatillo

Pancho Tomatillos are a strong, vigorous plant with a thick trunk. Taste the delicious sweetness from this tangy, apple–shaped tomatillo!



Italian Purple Eggplant

These vibrant, purple heirloom eggplants have a firm, mild flesh, which after cooking, becomes a rich, melted tender veggie perfect for sauces. This variety is great for slicing and cooking into Italian dishes.



African White Eggplant (round)

White Round African Eggplant is a tropical perennial originally from West Africa. Vigorous, disease resistant plants grow to between 2 and 4 feet in height and produce round, white fruits that are about 2 inches in diameter. The flavor is like true eggplants, though slightly more bitter.



Purple Excel Asian Eggplant

Purple Excel is a Chinese eggplant variety that produces high yields. Chinese eggplants are long and slender, with light purple skin and white flesh beneath the stem. They are less bitter than American or Italian eggplants and have a more delicate flavor.



Dunja Zucchini

Grow Dunja Zucchini with ease of mind as they are disease resistant to powdery mildew, papaya ringspot virus, zucchini yellow mosaic virus and more! This open plant has short spines, making it easy for you to harvest these dark green, tasty veggies.







Diva Cucumber

These Divas love to show-off but hate being bitter—add their extra sassy crisp, sweet flavor to any meal. Harvest these girls at 5–7 inches; harvest small for tons of flavor.






Eastern Magic Broccoli

Eastern Magic broccoli is a hybrid broccoli variety developed by Sakata for the Northeast US and Canada. It's a heat-tolerant, tall plant that produces 6–8 inch high-domed heads with blue-green beads and a nutty, buttery flavor.




	<p><i>Flash Collard Greens</i></p> <p>Flash collard greens are a hybrid variety of collard greens that are known for their vigor, uniformity, and high yields. They have broad, smooth, dark green leaves that grow on upright stalks that can reach almost 2 feet tall. Flash collards are resistant to bolting, which means they grow slowly and produce longer harvests.</p>
	<p><i>Rainbow Swiss Chard</i></p> <p>A beautiful chard, its colors are brilliant (pink, yellow, orange, red, and white). Very mild, ornamental, and tasty. Pretty enough to plant in the flower garden; so delicious and one of our favorite greens!</p>
	<p><i>Lettuce Mix</i></p> <p>Grab a handful of lettuce greens for a nutritious, crunchy salad! Wait 40 days for these bad boys to reach maturity and sophistication—or let the sun babysit them directly 6–8 hours while you go out and relax.</p>
	<p><i>Walking Onions</i></p> <p>Perennial. Beautiful and a center piece for any garden. The hardy bulbs set bulblets on stalks. Air-bound bulblets will sprout new smaller stalks, which fall over and replant themselves, hence the name Walking. Bulbs can be harvested over the fall and winter. Green onions can be harvested selectively as they grow. Mild taste.</p>

Herbs

	<p><i>Lemon Grass</i></p> <p>Lemon grass is a bushy perennial that thrives in warm, tropical environments. All they require is plenty of moisture and grow up to 3–4 feet.</p>
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	<p><i>Lemon Balm</i></p> <p>Perennial. Lemon balm is a member of the mint family, is considered a calming herb. Great for teas and flavor to dishes</p>
	<p><i>Borage</i></p> <p>BORAGE is like beenip! Pollinators love it! Borage flowers are annual, small, blue to purple flowers that are completely edible! Try these cucumber-like flowers in your salad as a garnish.</p>

Flowers

	<p><i>Black Eyed Susans</i></p> <p>Perennial. Thriving in full sunshine, Black Eyed Susans are bright-yellow, 2-3 inch wide, daisy-like flowers with dark centers. These flowers are native to prairies and open woodlands, and they can attract both birds and butterflies.</p>
	<p><i>Blanket Flowers</i></p> <p>Native perennial wildflowers They are known for their vibrant red and yellow daisy-like flowers and ability to withstand drought.</p>
	<p><i>Nasturtium</i></p> <p>Annual. Edible! five-petaled flowers that come in a variety of colors, including orange, red, yellow, and cream. They have a funnel shape with a short spur on the back, and broad, flat, green leaves. The flowers have a delicate texture and the leaves are flavorful, citrusy and peppery.</p>



English Daisy

Perennial. Bee lovers love these open-pollinator, vibrant flowers. English Daisies flourish best in partial shade or full sun and can grow in 12-inch pots on a patio or terrace. Make sure you hydrate these buggers with 1–2 inches of water a week.
